

## Scout Camps

- § **Ben Delatour:** BDSR offers patrol cooking or dining hall meals, also has rock climbing and rappelling. Shooting and over 30 merit badges
- § **Elkhorn High Adventure Base:** Offers older Scouts Programs such as backpacking treks into backcountry wilderness area, rappelling, rock climbing, black powder, Located on the Ben Delatour Scout Ranch

## Mountain biking trails

- § **Horse Tooth Rock Mountain Biking Trail:** This is a steep climb up to HorseTooth Rock, at the top there are great views of Horsetooth Mountain Park, Horsetooth Reservoir, and the Fort Collins area. This is an advance trail and is 5.5 miles round-trip and should take at least one hour,
- § **Yong Gulch Mountain biking trail:** This is for intermediate and or beginners. Stream crossings and shady conditions make this a cooler ride when burning hot outside. It is 10.3 miles round-trip and should take 1.5-2 hours.

## Hiking Activities

- § **Comanche Lake Trail:** This trail is located in the Comanche Peak Wilderness. This is an easy trail and is 2.2 miles round trip and should take approximately 1 hour.
- § **Lily Mountain Trail:** This is a more intermediate trail and is 4 miles round trip and should take about 2-2.5 hours. "The view from Lily Mountain makes the climb worthwhile"
